Project Status

The project is currently in the design phase, which includes a formal Historic Structural Report.

The Fountain has been drained and will remain empty until completion of the restoration project.

A fence has been erected around the perimeter of the Fountain for the safety and security of the public and the Fountain.

The Tom LaBonge Aqueduct Centennial Gardens will remain open.

The schedule will be updated as design progresses.

Project Description

The William Mulholland Memorial Fountain Restoration Project will return this iconic Los Angeles attraction to its original glory.

The Fountain was constructed in 1940 and named in honor of William Mulholland, a civil engineer who constructed the first Los Angeles Aqueduct, which has served as a vital source of water to Angelenos for over a century.

The Fountain received an aesthetic restoration in 1998 and another in 2013. The pump units, including many other
